Main professional experience

Mrs Rowe has extensive experience of London market and world-wide insurance and reinsurance principles and practice, gathered over nearly fifteen years as a leading market participant in the role of Claims Manager for the Kiln syndicate at Lloyd's, and twenty as an independent reinsurance consultant.

Current professional activities include provision of arbitration, mediation and expert witness services and expert opinions, technical consultancy, audit and inspection services and advisory assistance on reinsurance, binding authority and insurance matters to members of the Lloyd's and London insurance and reinsurance market, predominantly but not exclusively in the areas of reinsurance market practice, claims handling, reserving and IBNR calculation, commutations, contract wordings and technical accounting.

While at Kiln, Phillippa had extensive experience, in both a leading and following capacity, of management, adjustment, reserving, negotiation and settlement of claims in all classes of non-marine insurance and reinsurance including USA primary and excess casualty insurance and reinsurance. She is familiar with APH claims and the papers produced by the various London Market. working parties and claims committees. As a consultant she has carried out numerous inspections of claims records, including US APH and other major casualty claims, and has given expert evidence on related matters, including general London Market claims handling practices and reserving for claims, in the English High Court and at numerous arbitrations in England, the USA and Canada. She continues to lecture and advise clients on claims management techniques and on estimation of IBNR claims. She has just completed co-authorship of the Chartered Insurance Institute's Diploma examination 2009 coursebook on "Claims Practice".

Mrs Rowe is a past Chairman of The Academy of Experts and a member of The Academy's Fellows' Vetting Committee, responsible for accrediting applicants for fellowship of The Academy, its highest practising qualification.

Dispute resolution experience

Mrs Rowe is available as an experienced **expert witness, arbitrator, expert determiner or mediator** in reinsurance and related matters. She is an accredited expert witness on the Academy of Experts' Register, and is included in the Chartered Insurance Institute's list of reinsurance experts, and is an accredited arbitrator on the ARIAS(UK) panel of reinsurance arbitrators, and an accredited mediator.

First party experience: Mrs Rowe has extensive experience of claims negotiation and settlement, litigation and arbitration and of litigation support and provides investigative analysis, opinions and consultancy to parties contemplating or engaged in insurance and reinsurance disputes. While working

at Lloyd's she handled, as representative of a leading syndicate, a large number of claims in litigation or arbitration, and facilitated compromise settlements and commutations, and was a signatory, on behalf of the Kiln syndicates, of the "Wellington Agreement" for the handling of US asbestos-related claims.

Expert and other evidence: Mrs. Rowe has twice been deposed (in the US) as the defendant in USA insurance cases, has appeared as witness of fact in a London reinsurance arbitration, and acted as expert witness in several reinsurance arbitration and litigation matters, and in Lloyd's Names Action Group cases. Mrs Rowe appeared as an expert witness, and gave oral evidence, before Cresswell J. in the Commercial Court on behalf of the Merrett Names' Action Group in *Deeny & Others-v-Gooda Walker Ltd.* She has given oral evidence as an expert at several arbitration hearings in London and Ontario and been deposed as an expert witness in the USA. Phillippa has prepared expert evidence for other jurisdictions including Massachusetts, USA and Israel.

Mediation: Mrs Rowe is an experienced and successful mediator, accredited by The Academy of Experts' and a member of its Register of Qualified Dispute Resolvers (QDR number 47), and by Nottingham Law School on behalf of ARIAS(UK) and a member of the ARIAS(UK) panel of mediators. She has acted as a court appointed Mediator in the London County Court where she has conducted a large number of mediations, and sits as mediator in insurance market and other large commercial disputes, and court referred cases via the National Mediation Helpline. In total Mrs Rowe has conducted some 25 mediations, of which approximately 75% have successfully resulted in settlements. She is lead assessor for accreditation of mediators for The Academy of Experts' Register and acts for the Nottingham Law School faculty of dispute resolution as an assistant trainer of mediators for the ARIAS(UK) mediators' accreditation course.

Arbitration: In September 1998 Mrs Rowe was elected to Panel Membership of ARIAS (UK), the "AIDA Reinsurance and Insurance Arbitration Society of the UK". She sat as third arbitrator in Bermuda in an international reinsurance dispute, the subject of the 2002 Privy Council decision *Associated Electric vs European Re,* and has been appointed arbitrator in a number of reinsurance related disputes. Mrs Rowe is listed in the Reinsurance Association of America (RAA) Directory of reinsurance arbitrators. Mrs Rowe is a member of the Worshipful Company of Arbitrators.

Adjudication/Expert Determination: Mrs Rowe has been appointed a Scheme Adjudicator under the WFUM Companies Scheme of Arrangement. She teaches and examines in Expert Determination for The Academy of Experts.

Other professional associations

Mrs Rowe is a member of the British Insurance Law Association and of the London Fellows Group of the Chartered Insurance Institute, and former Secretary (1991-1993) of its Fellows' London and Overseas Region. From 1990 to 1999 she was a Council member of The Academy of Experts and from 1998 to 1999 was a Vice-Chairman of the Academy of Experts and Dean (to April 1999) of its Faculty of Mediation and ADR. Mrs Rowe was Chairman of The Academy of Experts from 2004 to 2005. She is currently Chairman Elect of The Academy of Experts, and takes office as Chairman in January 2010.

She was co-opted to the recent BILA sub-committee making recommendations to the Law Reform Commission on possible reform of insurance contract law, and was until the Society's dissolution a member of the Legislation Panel of the CII's Society of Fellows.

In May 2006 Mrs Rowe was elected to the committee of ARIAS(UK).

She is a member of the Association of Northern Mediators, a mediator member of the Civil Mediation Council, and was a member of the Association of Run-Off Companies until 2007.

Lecturing, training and writing

Mrs Rowe has lectured at the CII College of Insurance and for LLP Ltd/dyp on reinsurance subjects and for the Academy of Experts and the Council of Legal Education and elsewhere on alternative dispute resolution subjects. In 1994 she addressed a LIRMA Forum on the subject of ADR for reinsurance disputes.

She is a frequent speaker and lecturer at public seminars presented by Hawksmere, Falconbury and other conference organisers on reinsurance and dispute resolution subjects. She has designed and presented two one-day workshops on reinsurance subjects for Hawksmere, and has assisted the Hawksmere plc conference and publishing organisation and others with the design of other public seminars on reinsurance subjects.

During 2006 Mrs Rowe presented a programme of courses on claims handling and reinsurance subjects for Insurance Market Conferences Limited. She is a tutor on Academy of Experts training courses on expert witness, expert determination and mediation topicas.

Mrs Rowe has published several articles in, for example, ReActions, Global Reinsurance, ForeSight, Reinsurance, The Expert and the CII Society of Fellows' Journal, and has contributed a chapter on "Expert evidence in insurance and reinsurance cases" to Mark Cato's The Expert in Litigation and Arbitration (LLP Limited, 1999).
